The text is a conflation and paraphrase of descriptions of dogs awaiting adoption at Battersea dogs and cats (sic) home.



Narrator's script

At the end of each boxed section, leave *approximately* the number of seconds indicated on the right.

Bobby is a large male Saluki cross, aged 2 and a half years. He prefers to live away from the inner city. He can't live with children or other dogs; he can't live with cats.	5
Bobby had a poor start in life; he came to us underweight, scared of loud noises, and showing hostile and possessive behaviours that new owners will need to have experience in dealing with; these behaviours will need management and training and he will need to live in an adult-only home.	6
Bobby has struggled with being left alone, even for very short periods of time, crying and barking constantly; he is likely to need a lot of time and dedication in this area. If his new owners are prepared to give him time and attention, then he will soon settle in.	8
Underneath his anxieties, Bobby has a playful and zoomy nature and loves to bounce around with his doggy pals in the shelter. He will need space; preferably a large private garden, his new owners' full attention, and a patient, consistent routine. He responds well to edible treats!	5


Performance notes

- The narrator's script may be pre-recorded or performed live.
- The basset horn takes cues from the narration; after the initial precision entry (marked with a double-dashed vertical line) these are approximate (single dashed vertical line), with a leeway of up to a bar in either direction.
- The clarinet part is marked at about crotchet = 120, but may need to be altered for performance with the narrator. The playing should be very free, with phrases played as gestures more than as counted notes. Feel free to change the tempo, and to manipulate the rests, to fit in with the narration as you see fit.
- 'wait' indicates that the narrator is unaccompanied once your phrase has finished, until the next approximate entry.
- If both narration and playing are live, then great freedom may be taken with the tempi, rests, and the pauses in narration, responding to each other.
- Bars 14-18 and 48-9: the hum should be approximately the pitch of the played note, moving around slightly to create distortion.


