## Humming Suite

Four short pieces for clavichord (with vocalising)

- 1: absent-mindedly
- 2: wondering
- 3: listening
- 4: self-soothing

*Total duration c.4 minutes*

Written for and premiered by Francis Knights in Cambridge 2021, this tiny suite explores the different functions of humming (a favourite activity of mine!). This relates to the intimacy of the clavichord – it's as if we're privy to a series of free-floating thoughts, and fleeting moods, expressed musically, rather than hearing an external and formal performance.
